General announcements

- HES Executive Committee approved unanimously the Contract Renewal offered by CUP
 - Three year renewal (2024-2026)
 - Proprietor share of 50% net annual income ("actual cash received net of any agency discount/sales commissions or possible other third-party fees.
 Essentially, there are some costs associated with processing sales.") —no longer 65% of royalty as it has been the case in the recent years
 - Production costs (copyediting, typesetting, etc.) borne out by CUP
 - a per-Member fee of \$46 per volume
 - 75% annual advance and 85% guarantee on forecasted royalty
 - Editors' control over production decisions (copyediting)


