York University finally migrated LISTSERV to a new server on May 3, 2022 so a modern

browser can once again be used by subscribers to join and by me to distribute messages.

Unfortunately, the date information in the archives were damaged during this migration. Here is

an email exchange that highlights the problem:

From me to York IT:

1) I was looking at the archive and it only goes back to 2006? I changed the date order and the earliest one was March 2006. We had messages in the archives back to Feb 1995.

Reply from York IT:

I had my team investigate the missing archive issue and I have good news and bad news!

The good news is that all the archives are accounted for, but the bad news is that the new listserv is displaying the data differently than the older software.

They believe that "something" happened back in March 2006, perhaps an import of the archives...(this is just speculative as we don't have any data to back this up) with resulted in a change to the date of the document.

There are hundreds of archive documents with that exact date stamp.

My team checked the backup that we took before the migration and the data was the same as it is now, so this did not occur during the migration.

I sorted in reverse date order and hovered over the first entry: HES meeting workshops and the Date stamp is March 31, 2006, but the actual Date sent was Feb 19, 1995. So, the real issue is that the new software is displaying the date the document was modified and the old software was displaying the Sent date...they double checked and could not find a work-around for the date display.

Thank you for investigating.


It's puzzling how messages pre-Mar 2006 lost their dates. There was an import of messages from our previous host, but I don't understand how the dates got changed like that.
