1. The Conference Planning Committee shall consist of a chair and three additional members, serving for four-year terms with one member selected each year. The chair shall normally be chosen from the members who have already served the first two years of their terms.

STANDING COMMITTEES

1. The Conference Planning Committee shall consist of a chair and three additional appointed members, serving for four-year terms with one member selected each year. The chair shall normally be chosen from the members who have already served the first two years of their terms. The Vice-President shall sit as an ex officio member of the Conference Planning Committee with full voting rights, but shall not be eligible to serve as chair.

Rationale:

After almost a decade working under the new constitution, the Executive Committee has come to realize that a closer collaboration between the Executive Committee and the Conference Planning Committee is required to guarantee effective fulfilment of this critical strategic function. Since the Vice-President will be the officer mainly responsible for overseeing the implementation of the decisions made by the Conference Planning Committee, their presence as an *ex officio* member seems like an appropriate way of securing this closer collaboration. In keeping with the spirit of the constitution, we suggest adding an *ex officio* member to the committee's existing structure, rather than replacing one of the appointed members. We thus hope to ensure that the Conference Planning Committee will continue to comprise a broad set of voices and perspectives, and that its work will remain outside the direct purview of the Executive Committee.
